Testimony Corner: Sharon Pratt

Dear Friends and Family, I am writing this letter to you to encourage you to draw near to God, (Hebrews 10:22), to hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering, (Hebrews 10:23), and to consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works....
